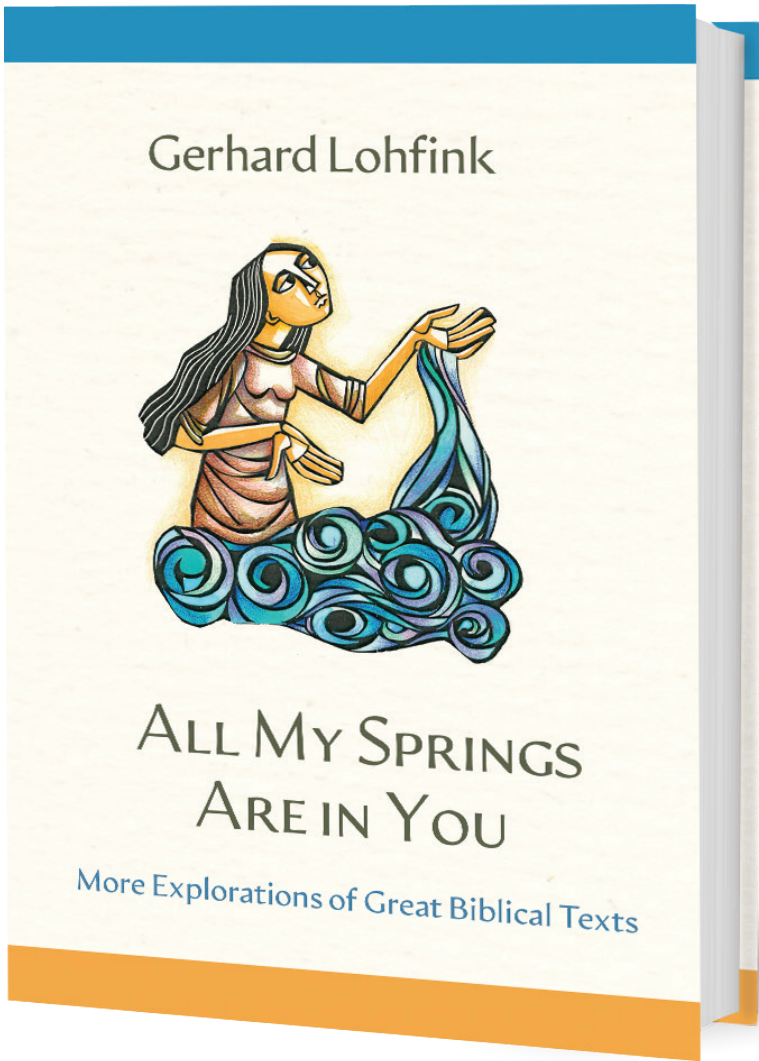

All My Springs Are in You

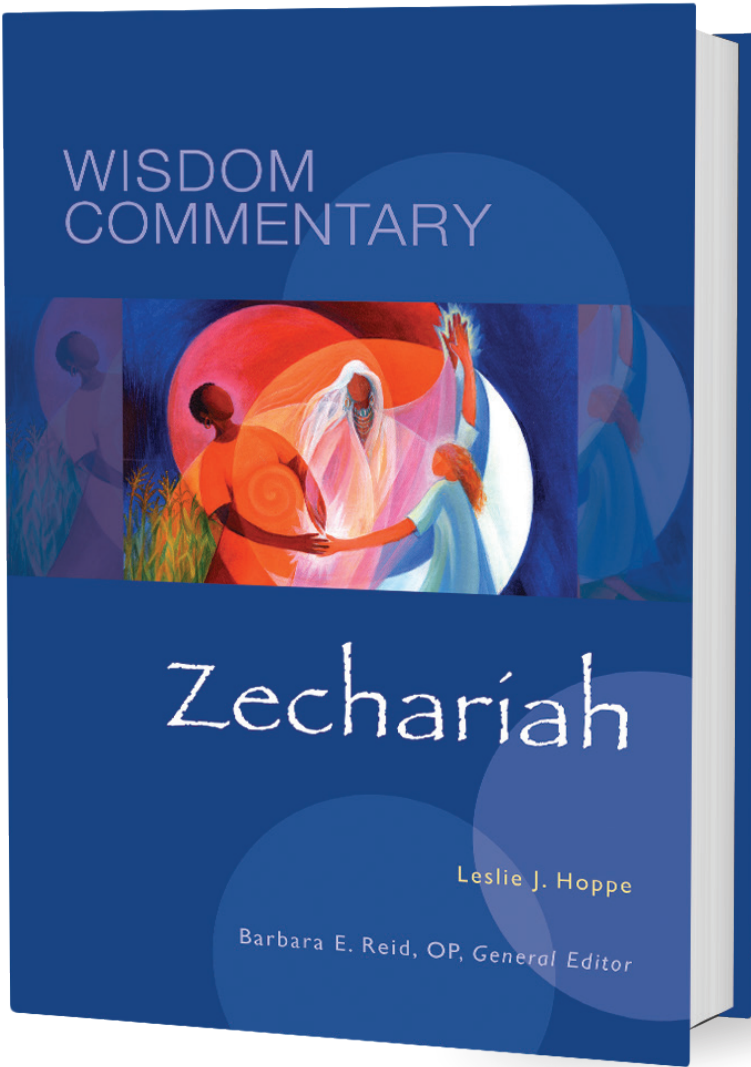

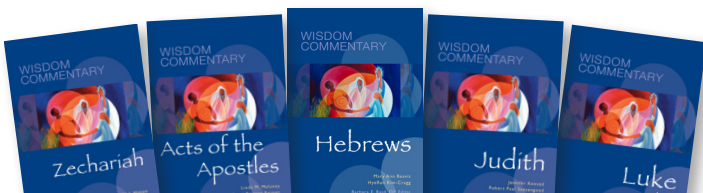


Zechariah

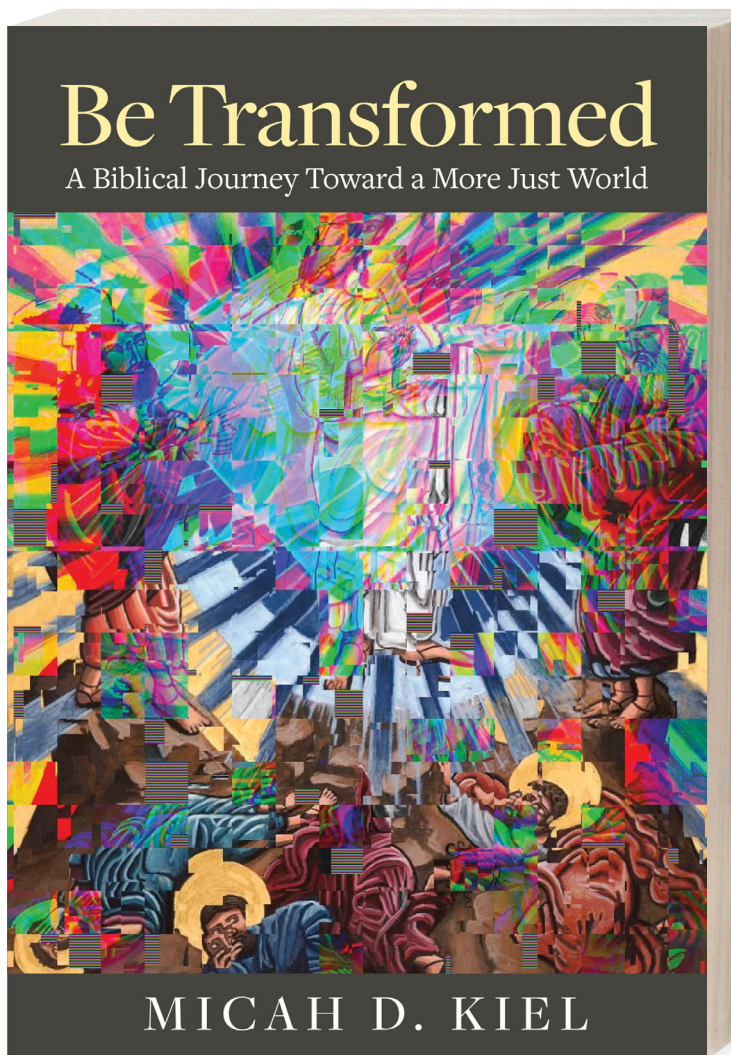
