Dear Friends,

The Synod in Rome this fall will be unlike any other, both in its membership, organization, and themes for discussion. Modern synods have so far consisted of bishops and a few invited specialists, thus emphasizing the hierarchical and teaching nature of the Church. Calling for a wider representation this fall is, among other things, an acknowledgment of the desire to truly listen to the Spirit speaking in and to the whole Church. It is also a nod to the Church’s notion of its own nature and mission having been in a continual development since the beginning, all within the living tradition of the People of God journeying as—and listening to—a community of shared participation and co-responsibility.

As an apostolate of Saint John’s Abbey, we at Liturgical Press recognize and receive these themes of community, shared participation, and co-responsibility as nothing new, really. Rather, they have been a deep and integral part of a dynamic tradition of western monastic experience and wisdom for 1,500 years: Each one of us, pope or pauper, is a follower of Jesus, called daily to “Listen carefully ... and incline the ear of your heart” (Prologue of the Rule of Benedict). We actually think you might find reminders and insights on these themes in every book we publish.

During the lockdown caused by the Covid-19 crisis, streets were emptied, churches closed, and a relationship with nature developed in which questions to be asked again in light of the crisis arose: Is God present in nature? Is communion with God in nature possible? Is there a relationship between the God of creation, the God of history, and the God we worship in Sunday liturgies?

In *Nature Praising God*, Dermot Lane explores these questions by returning to the Bible. The Christian tradition shows that nature is understood as a living community, is graced by God, and has a sacramental character. He suggests that readers change their perception of how nature is traditionally regarded as a resource for human needs—and embrace a new way of praising God through an appreciation of and care for the myriad life forms on earth. The result of these explorations is the outline of a new theology of nature praising God, with lessons for the way we worship God in our churches today.
